Treasurer's Report

Dear Brothers,

The Zeta Chi Alumni Association has significantly improved our financial situation from this point last year. The

Alumni have responded to the Trustees request for regular annual contributions to meet the operating budget of the Alumni Association. We have paid our taxes and insurance in full and are starting to build our reserves to cover those expenses in the year to come. Our annual operating budget is listed below:

Insurance	\$11,000
House Loan from Educational Fund	\$6,000
House Maintenance	\$6,000
Newsletter	\$2,000
Miscellaneous	\$3,000
Taxes	\$6,000
Total	\$34,000
Active Chapter Rent	\$12,000
Alumni Contributions Needed	\$22,000

Our operating budget has increased by \$4,000 over last year's budget. This increase is primarily due to an increase in insurance premiums and house maintenance expenses. Likewise, we are asking that the Alumni increase their contributions by ten percent over last year's \$20,000 to help cover these additional expenses.

In addition to the regular annual operating budget, the Board of Trustees and Alumni present at the Annual Alumni Meeting agreed to raise an additional \$70,000 for the improvement and renovation of the Chapter House. Enclosed you will find a pledge form for a special fund that has been established for these improvements and renovations. I hope that you will take the time to make your annual contribution, plus an extra contribution to help the Trustees provide quality accommodations for our Active Chapter.
